



The Northland Vietnam Veterans Memorial Foundation was established in 1994 with twofold purpose. First, maintaining the condition of the Northland Vietnam Veterans Memorial located on the Lake Superior Lake Walk and second, promoting the memory and commitment of those who served during the Vietnam War.

In 2016 the family of Frank W. Budd, MD, Capt USN would like to offer a \$750 scholarship to promote the importance and commitment of our medical personnel who serve in the military in time of war and peacetime. Frank was part of the Senior Medical School Program of the US Navy. After graduating from Indiana University Medical School and finishing his Internship at Cincinnati General Hospital, in 1961 he began his military career at Camp Pendleton, CA with the first Marine Division. He then went on to a Navy Orthopedic Residency at AUS Naval Hospital Portsmouth, VA, followed by children's orthopedics at Kernan Hospital, Baltimore, MD. In 1968 Dr. Budd served with the 3rd Marine Battalion, 3rd Marine Division in I Corp Field Hospitals in Vietnam. After Vietnam he was stationed at US Naval Hospital Yokosuka, Japan. He retired from Naval Reserve in 1992. In 1972 he and his family moved to Duluth where he was employed at the Duluth Clinic, started his own private practice and joined Orthopedic Associates in 1983. He was a consulting orthopedic surgeon for the VA out-patient clinic in Superior, WI. He retired from medical practice in 1999.

Our organization offers one scholarship to a student accepted in the medical field to qualified candidates residing in six (6) Minnesota counties of St. Louis, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching and Lake and two (2) Wisconsin counties of Douglas and Bayfield. The scholarship is based solely upon the paper written on the subject listed on application. The award categories and qualifications are listed below.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT

A verifiable relative child, grandchild, sibling, niece/nephew of a Vietnam era veteran (including step family)

Graduating senior, cumulative GPA of 3.0

Verifiable acceptance to an accredited university or technical college within the United States

COLLEGE STUDENT or TECHNICAL/VOCATIONAL SCHOOL

A verifiable Vietnam veteran or relative of a Vietnam veteran (including step family)

Completed at least 26 academic credits in an accredited program maintaining a cumulative GPA of 2.0

Verifiable, full time, registered student at a college/technical or Vocational School within the United States
